

Conversion Chart: Turning Standards Based Scores into Composite Grades

Note: please use this chart thoughtfully. Whenever possible, keep target scores separate, as this gives accurate information about a precise skill. But...when you have to come up with a single grade (say, for a summative assessment or at the end of a unit), here is a way to be consistent. Remember, always accompany a composite grade with specific target information—show students and parents how the individual skills led to the single grade.
